Cynthia is a signature member of Mid-Southern Watercolorist, won many art awards including first place twice in "Works on Paper" at the Cotter Plein Air Festival sponsored by the White River Artist Guild. For ten years Cynthia traveled around the world teaching watercolor classes on cruise ships.

Her work focuses on themes of landscape, nature and portraits. She has always been intrigued with different environments and that sense of place which makes any particular location unique. This can include the natural geographic features of the landscape, as well as the human alternations to the land. Most of her imagery reflects the Arkansas River Valley, Mount Nebo and Lake Desoto in Hot Springs Village, where her vacation homes are located.

Linda Larey has always loved art and am a compulsive drawer/doodler. At Texas Tech a majored in advertising art, switching to art education after I married. I"ve also done post graduate work in fine art at the University of Houston, Clear Lake City. But after my second child was born, I found that I just didn't have the discipline to set time aside for art and for the next 25 years did nothing. Then one day, I called Jeanne Edwards who had been my oldest son's high school art teacher to see how I could go about taking up where I left off. She invited me to join her Tuesday night painting group at Arkansas High. It was sort of like relearning to ride a bike - it came back quickly. I am blessed to be able to do something that I love so much. I have presented demos for various groups, conducted several a life drawing and watercolor workshops. My work hangs in several businesses and galleries in the Four States area.



John Keller, born and raised in the panhandle of Nebraska, has made his home in Arkansas since 1978, teaching at Harding University where he served as Chair of the Department of Art & Design from 2000 till 2014. He earned his BA in Art from Harding University in 1971 and taught public school art from 1972 till 1978. He earned the MA and PhD from the University of Nebraska, both in Art Education, with a parallel concentration in studio art.

John works primarily in watercolor, but also in oils and photography. His subjects include landscape, structures, flora, fauna, studies in light and shadow, and the effects of time on the natural and man made environment.

John is a signature member of Mid-Southern Watercolorists. His art includes images captured during his travel in the United States, Europe and the Middle East, having taught on Harding's International Program campuses numerous times.
