#### From the Desk of the Director of MSW Regional Advisors, Charlotte Rierson

We are continuing to feature our Regional Advisors this year. For Oct we have Sandy Barksdale of Cotter, Inis Ray of Pine Bluff and Kay Aclin of Fort Smith. See the Regional Map and code to locate your Region and Advisor. We are so pleased to have these outstanding artists representing MSW.



Inis Danley Ray is an award winning artist. She joined the Pine Bluff Art League in 2001 and entered the Pine Bluff Art League Annual Juried Exhibit in 2002. Since 2002 she has been fortunate to have her artwork *juried into show* every year to-date and has *won many awards* in this show.) Inis served as President of the Pine Bluff Art League in 2004, 2005, 2007, 2008, and 2010. The excellent artists in this organization have been strong educators for Inis' continuing art growth. Inis also has membership in the Arts and Science Center Museum for Southeast Arkansas and has served on their Exhibit Committee. She also belongs to the Arkansas League of Artists\_the Mid-Southern Watercolorist\_and the Arkansas Arts Council\_located in Little Rock, AR She never tires of studying the approximately two-hundred art books that she has acquired and takes workshops at every opportunity. Inis really enjoys being creative and prefers the indirect method of painting. She usually uses a range of methods to create a field of texture, and then possibly adds a realism touch to the painting. She enjoys the complete abstracts and non-objective composition as well. Inis also enjoys the "field and ground" style of painting where the colors and values entwine. With this style the figure, or subject, is slightly hidden and all you see is the abstract composition. But then the figure will become obvious.

Inis began studying in 1985 using oils. She has taken workshops and studied under Garland Jenkins, Curator of the Arts and Science Center for Southeast Arkansas; Richard Stephens of Hot Springs, AR; Sue Conners of Florida; Amy Hill-Imler of Little Rock, AR. Amy Hill-Imler has been a steady influence in art instruction for Inis and she has been the instructor most instrumental in guiding her into the abstract/non-objective field. Other artists from the Little Rock area such as Bob Snider, Cynthia Schanink, Jackie Fish, Sandra Newberg, Marcia Bingham, Bill Burgin, Mary Ann and Arlette Miller have contributed to Inis' art experiences. She also attended an excellent workshop by Fred Rawlinson, Memphis, TN.



**Sandy Barksdale** lives in the Cotter/Mountain Home area of north central Arkansas. Her works include watercolor, acrylic, oil, alcohol ink, and pen-and-ink. Her creative interpretations of environmentally oriented subjects, such as nature scenes, flowers, and old barns, reflect a love of the outdoors she shares with her photographer husband, Bill.

Sandy graduated from Fort Smith High School, the University of Arkansas with a B.S. in Education, and did graduate work at the University of Memphis.

Sandy is a Diamond Signature Member of Mid-Southern Watercolorists, a Signature Member of Arkansas League of Artists, recipient of Texas and Neighbors Regional Art Exhibition's Chairman Award, Watercolor USA purchase award recipient, and she received a purchase award for the Arkansas Arts Council permanent collection for a Small Works on Paper 2016 painting.

Sandy organized and was president of White River Artists and Chairman of Plein Air on the White River from 2009 – 2015. From 2010 to the present, she has been Regional Advisor for Mid-Southern Watercolorists, member of the Arkansas Artist Registry, Artists of Northwest Arkansas, Memphis Germantown Art League, and (Mountain Home) Area Art Club.

Sandy is pleased that a number of north central artists are members of Mid-Southern Watercolorists, and she encourages watercolor artists in her region to contact her about becoming involved with MSW.



Kay Aclin is a versatile artist whose subject\_matter covers a wide variety. She has worked in many mediums, but watercolor truly captured her heart. It's "unexpected" nature brings joy and challenge to her work. She has studied with master watercolorists across the county-Tony Couch, John Salminen, Doug Walton, Karen Vernon, Timothy Clark, etc.

Kay is a signature member of Mid-Southern Watercolorists. She is also a member of the Hoover Watercolor Society, Museum of Women in the Arts, Who's Who in Women's Arts, Center for Art and Education, Ft. Smith Regional Art Museum and a member of the Arkansas Art Registry. She is a regional Advisor for the MSW. Many Honors have been awarded to Kay including Best of Shows add many first prizes. She has been a recipient of the MSW's Purchase Award and in 2005 and the mayor of Ft. Smith presented her with the Visual Arts Award. She has had many solo shows and she and her sister (also an award winning artist) have had sister exhibitions in AR, LA, and TX. She has been showcased in the Arkansas Governor's Calendar for each edition and has been featured in Art Galleries and Artists of the South as well as Du South (March issue this year). Kay's body of work, "Colored Water" has been represented by the Blue Moon Art Gallery in Hot Springs, AR. for the past twelve years. ### Schanink's Mini-workshop
