We moved to Yellville, Arkansas where I met Jo Rowell, the school art teacher in a small town of population 1500 people. I enrolled my children in her private after school art classes and then I asked her if she could teach me. It was one of the best decisions I have ever made. She instructed me in oil and pastel painting. It was Shelia Parsons who later showed me the magic of watercolor and started me on this lifetime love.

I owe so much to Jo Rowell, Shelia Parsons and all the workshop instructers I have had the privilege to study with along my journey. I want to share the excitement of watercolor with others. That's one of the reasons I joined MSW. I wanted to meet other artists and learn together how we can promote the love of watercolor in our schools, our communities and our country. I hope you also want to share your talent and time with others.



A lot is happening in April and May this year: perhaps we'll even get some real Spring weather soon! At any rate, I wanted to share with you where and when I'll be showing my newest art works this season, and also tell you about the new class I'll be teaching at the Maumelle Center on the Lake in May. Here's what is scheduled:

- •Five of my newest pastel landscapes are showing at the Arkansas Rep during the "Mama Mia" production. This is scheduled to end on April 16.
- •I have two acrylic landscapes at the Conway League of Artists exhibit at the Faulkner County Library until April 28.
- •2nd Friday Art Night is April 13 in downtown Little Rock. I will have a booth at the Rep Annex (518 Main St.) from 5 8 pm.
- •My watercolor, "Unchained" was accepted into the Mid-Southern Watercolorists Annual Juried Exhibit at the Butler Center (100 Rock Street in downtown Little Rock) and will hang there until June 30.
- •Since I didn't get accepted for the Delta Exhibition at the Arkansas Arts Center this year, I am eligible to show at the 3rd Annual Delta des Refuses counter-exhibition from June to August at the Cox Creative Center and the Butler Center. My entry is an acrylic painting of a childhood memory, "My Mother's Ribbons."
- •Natural Impressions Studio at 4609 Aspen Drive in North Little Rock will have its annual art show and sale May 12 (the day before Mother's Day). I will show some of my work there -- time slot is unknown at the present.
- •Continuing gallery showings include Art on the Green in Conway (pastel landscapes), the Butler Center in Little Rock (pen and ink drawings), and Eurekan Art in Eureka Springs (limited edition prints).
- •Last but not least, I will be teaching a Pen and Ink drawing class at the Maumelle Center on Thursday afternoons beginning May 10. Instruction will also include ink washes and scratch board drawing. If you are interested, send me an email and I will forward the materials list to you.
