The Paint Outs will start at 10 a.m. and end at 3 p.m. (or whenever you want to leave).

The Levy Church of Christ, 5124 Camp Robinson Rd, North Little Rock, AR 72118, has graciously offered us the use of a large space for our Gatherings, with wonderful natural light, plentiful free parking, and easy access.

Watercolor Landscapes Paint Along will be on Tuesday mornings at the Arts Center, 9 to noon, beginning September 11th. Learn to paint the elements of the Arkansas landscape -- towering trees, meandering rivers, majestic hills, cozy barns, verdant fields, colorful skies. We'll work step-by-step, with each step demonstrated first. Enroll for 10 weeks, or for one of the two 5-week sessions. est Moves East with Watercolor. Also beginning Tuesday, September 11th, in the afternoons, 1 to 4 p.m. During this 8-week class, learn to use Western watercolor supplies to explore the Eastern aesthetic sensibilities of tranquility and simplicity. Seek the spirit of each landscape. Projects are provided for each class, with an instructor demo or work on your own. *Enrollment* for the two Arkansas Arts Center classes starts Monday, August 13th for currently enrolled (summer semester) students, or Monday, August 20th for all others. Explore the catalogue of Museum School classes, and enroll electronically at arkansasartscenter.org, or phone 501-396-0353, or register in-person in the Museum School Office. AAC member and non-member prices will be listed for each class.

Watercolor with the Masters will begin Monday, September 10th, 9 to 11:30 at Center on the Lake in Maumelle. These 8 classes help you to study art history, as we also paint-along. Explore the intimate lives and paintings of master artists such as Charles Burchfield, Claude Monet, Paul Signac, Georgia O'Keeffe, Winslow Homer, and more. Drawings for each painting we do will be provided, and the instructor will demonstrate each step.

Enrollment for the Maumelle Center on the Lake class starts Tuesday August 21st. You must be a Center on the Lake member. Membership is available to anyone 50 years old, or older. The annual membership fee is \$25 for Maumelle residents (or \$40 for non-residents), and is prorated by the month of the year. The cost of the 8-week Watercolor with the Masters class is \$63. By portraying the species that biologists and conservation organizations are working to preserve globally the goal of ABUN is to help raise awareness for endangered species through the art of participating artists, which is freely given for educational and marketing purposes. Artists play a vital role as the voice for the voiceless and vanishing wildlife on our planet.

Kitty and Christoph currently live in Brazil, they also retain a residence in Little Rock. Many members of MSW have known Kitty through the years for her contributions to the Arkansas art scene.
